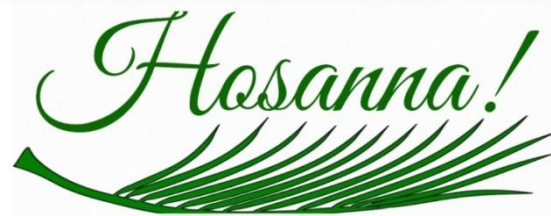

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum - from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. We join with all people of our Parish - and in spirit with all Christians in every time and place - to fast, pray and keep watch. It is the Passover of the Lord.

HOLY THURSDAY: 7:00 pm - Solemn Remembrance of Jesus' Last Supper

GOOD FRIDAY: 3:00 pm - Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion and Death.

Good Friday is the day of fasting and abstinence.

Fasting means eating only one full meal and two smaller meals which means we should experience some degree of hunger (eating between meals is prohibited).

Abstinence means abstaining from meat and alcohol. The law of abstinence binds all persons who have completed their 14th year of age. Those persons who have completed their 18th year of age are bound by the law of fasting until they have completed their 59th year of age.

Parents are reminded of their duty to introduce children to the understanding and importance of penance. Adult's examples will be the greatest influence in this matter.

At the end of our celebration on Holy Saturday there will be blessing of food, which we will eat for Easter breakfast. (Pascha – Risen Christ, Babka - Blessed Mother, Beets - Stain of sin, Cream cheese - Purity and goodness, Butter - Burial ointment, Pysanky - Resurrection, Horseradish - Suffering, Salt – God's grace, Meat - Joyful celebration, Vinegar – Gall, Chocolate bunnies - Symbolizes modern times.
